Meet Kareem Salama, cowboy crooner

He's a lawyer with a chemical engineering degree, a classical poetry fan and a faithful Muslim. It's hard to pin a label on **Kareem Salama**, except one: He's *all* country, from his thick accent and horse-riding hobby to his new music career. After moving to Houston to practice law, the Oklahoma-raised crooner recently cut his first record, the radio-ready *Generous Peace*—the translation of his Arabic name—at top recording studio Sugar Hill, and it's set for spring release. Salama sees more complement than contradiction in his country style and his Muslim faith. "[Most country music is] rooted in the Christian ethos which, after all, is pretty similar to the Islamic ethos."
